The open session of the hybrid meeting was called to order by Chair John Hine at 5:00 P.M. followed by a motion to move into Executive Session to discuss property, fiber projects, and the General Manager's review and contract and to return to open session at approximately 6:00 PM (see open session minutes for vote).

General Manager's review and contract:

Mr. Hine stated that the compensation committee and General Manager have not come to an agreement on Sean's contract. The full Board will need to meet in executive session. Mr. Hine will send out an email about possible dates.


Fiber: Mr. Fitzgerald stated that in the open session, they would hear about SHELD being accepted as an MBI qualified provider. Mr. Fitzgerald explained that being a qualified provider is necessary for future opportunities to administer grant funds from MBI and discussed a \$10 Million Residential Retrofit MBI grant that HG&E is seeking to construct fiber for the 70 properties of the Holyoke Housing Authority MDU properties.

HG&E requested SHELD's professional services to help craft RFPs, evaluate and detail the building construction costs, create the design and engineering plan, compile the list of materials, develop estimates and service costs for the grant. HG&E asked for our construction and fiber project management expertise, and they have agreed to pay for our services, mostly from Telecom Manager Bob Liswell, and the team, to do this work for the grant application.

If MBI awards the funds to HG&E, they will need a long-term retail ISP service provider and have asked SHELD of our interest to be an ISP provider in Holyoke. Management sees this as an excellent opportunity to further expand our fiber footprint. Bob Liswell toured and assessed the properties with MBI staff after a successful acceptance of the MBI grant application. There is no financial risk for SHELD and there would be revenue growth from acquiring additional subscribers. We may need to hire one more customer service person to serve the additional customers. A contractor will do the actual construction, SHELD will manage and operate the project. If HG&E decides to expand further, there could be additional ISP expansion opportunities for SHELD / Fiberspring, like we do for Shutesbury and Leverett, managing the retail fiber business.

SHELD management recommends the Board approve SHELD/Fiberspring to proceed with becoming HG&E's ISP provider should they get awarded the grant and enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with SHELD for ISP services.

On a motion by Mr. Dobosh, seconded by Mr. Coutu, it was unanimously VOTED: to authorize Mr. Fitzgerald and Fiberspring to pursue the opportunity with HG&E for the MBI contract and to authorize SHELD to provide ISP services for Holyoke.



On a motion by Mr. Terry, seconded by Mr. Dobosh, it was unanimously VOTED: To adjourn the executive session and return to the open session at 6:00PM.

The Executive Session ended at 5:54 PM.
